WHEREAS, Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC") has embarked on a project to procure a new Payment Service Provider to deliver significantly increased business functionality, improve responsiveness to customers, introduce substantial business improvements, and result in technology that can be embraced by PVWC's workforce and our customers; and

WHEREAS, the procurement process for the new system was conducted in accordance with the State of New Jersey Competitive Contracting Process (N.J.S.A. 40A:15-4.1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, following previous authorization by PVWC, and public advertisement as required by New Jersey law, in accordance with an appropriate form of notice, and placement of the said notice on the official website of PVWC, as well as in the official newspaper of PVWC and any other such publications as may have been deemed appropriate, on June 27, 2024, PVWC received five (5) proposals for Contract No. 24-C-03 "Competitive Contracting Procurement of Payment Service Provider" (the "Contract"); and

WHEREAS, PVWC's Technical Advisory Committee, along with the assistance of CGI Technologies and Solutions, Inc., "CGI" the consultant retained by PVWC for this Project, reviewed the bid proposal packages utilizing the previously weighted evaluation criteria set forth in the Contract, and two(2) responders were shortlisted for

further review, and to respond to PVWC's requests for questions and provide demonstrations of their services regarding their bid proposals; and

WHEREAS, following evaluation of demonstrations, the most responsive bid proposal submitted for this Contract, price and other factors considered, was that of Paymentus Corporation "Paymentus" of Charlotte North Carolina (the "Awardee"); and

WHEREAS, PVWC is desirous of awarding a three (3) year contract to Paymentus for these services; and

WHEREAS, PVWC has determined that based on the current usage of electronic payments that has been increasing steadily, the cost for Paymentus' services, in accordance with their proposal over a period of three years, shall result in a cost of \$600,000.00 per year for a total Not-to-Exceed of \$1,800,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Purchasing has submitted a memo, which includes the evaluation matrix, recommending award of Contract 24-C-03 is attached hereto and made a part hereof as **Exhibit A**; and

Based on the review of the proposals by CGI, two firms who best met our criteria were shortlisted for further evaluation. Each of the two firms selected gave presentations to the evaluating committee where they were able to highlight their skills and provide answers to a set of questions prepared by the evaluating committee. Based on the proposals and the presentations, the evaluation committee arrived at the weighted scores listed below. Based on those scores, it is recommended that Paymentus Corporation be awarded this project at a cost not-to-exceed \$1,800,000.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is between <u>Passaic Valley Water Commission</u>, hereinafter called "PVWC, ", and BlueTriton Brands, Inc., hereinafter called "BlueTriton."

I. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The purpose of this MOU is to identify the roles and responsibilities of each party as they relate to disasters in the instance that <u>PVWC</u>, requests assistance for bottled water from BlueTriton.

BlueTriton may act as a source in the event of disasters which require delivered bottled water to ABC Company, and will use all reasonable endeavors to satisfy the request of <u>PVWC</u> for delivered bottled water should transportation routes be accessible and should it have the resources available to do so at the time of the request without adversely affecting BlueTriton' ability to meet the needs of its other emergency management obligations, such as support for the Federal Emergency Management Administration, State Emergency Management Administrations, the Red Cross, AmeriCares, etc., other hospitals seeking water to service its patients, as well as the prior existing obligations to its customers.

While every emergency / disaster situation is different, the parties understand that BlueTriton generally would prioritize needs, and prepare to seek to support and deliver, along the following lines:

FEMA / State EMAs
Red Cross / AmeriCares / other charitable organizations
Local hospitals
Other customers and consumers who rely on our business

II. BACKGROUND

<u>Definition of Disaster</u> – BlueTriton and <u>PVWC</u>, agree to define "disaster" to mean the occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including, but not limited to, fire, flood, earthquake, wind, storm, wave action, oil spill or other water contamination requiring

emergency action to avert danger or damage, epidemic, extreme public health emergency, air contamination, blight, drought, critical material shortage, infestation, explosion, riot or hostile military or paramilitary action.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOU

<u>PVWC</u>, shall notify BlueTriton as soon as possible if delivered bottled water is needed and relates to emergencies resulting from a disaster as outlined in the Water Service Proposal dated September 19, 2024, and which is annexed hereto.

We recommend keeping at least a 24-hour supply on hand at all times. This will serve as an additional precaution, and will allow for <u>PVWC</u>, to begin immediate water distribution in the event of an emergency.

IV. BLUETRITON RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOU

BlueTriton shall undertake the following activities.

BlueTriton may act as a source for delivered bottled water for disaster-related services so long as doing so will not adversely affect the ability of BlueTriton to meet the needs of its other emergency management obligations, such as support for the Federal Emergency Management Administration, State Emergency Management Administrations, the Red Cross, AmeriCares, etc., other hospitals seeking water to service its patients, as well as the prior existing obligations to its customers. It will use all reasonable endeavors to satisfy the request of <u>PVWC</u>, for delivered bottled water should it have the resources available to do so at the time of the request in accordance with the previous sentence.

This commodity must be billed at BlueTriton' previous days' Time and/or Materials (T&M) customer rates as determined by BlueTriton. As it has in the past, BlueTriton may donate delivered bottled water in the event of a disaster.

VII. LIABILITY

BlueTriton shall not be liable to <u>PVWC</u> or any third party for any damages resulting from the inability of BlueTriton to satisfy the request of <u>PVWC</u>, for delivered bottled water.

VIII. EFFECTIVE DATE AND SIGNATURE

This MOU shall be effective upon the authorized signatures of <u>PVWC</u>, and BlueTriton and shall cover a term of twelve (12) months unless modified in writing by mutual consent of both parties or terminated by either party upon a 30-day advance written notice to the other.

CONTINUOUS MONITORING FOR TOTAL CHLOROPHYLL-a, PHYCOCYANIN, AND TURBIDITY AT PASSAIC RIVER BELOW TWO BRIDGES, NEW JERSEY

Problem

Demands on water resources in New Jersey require the availability of high-quality water for multiple uses. Numerous sources of pollution have deteriorated the quality of water resources within the State. Water resources planning must address these and other problems to ensure a water supply of high quality to meet future water needs. To assist in the management of these resources, continuous monitoring of water-quality conditions provides the necessary information on the quality of water resources. Continuous monitoring of turbidity, chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin in combination with existing continuous monitoring of dissolved oxygen and pH improve the identification of algal blooms, which, in turn, lead to degraded water quality downstream of the monitoring location. When the algal biomass is too great, the health of other aquatic biota may be adversely affected. Excessive algae concentrations of certain classes, such as blue-green, also create taste, odor, and water clarity issues for the production of drinking water. Water resource managers, when made aware of incipient algal blooms, may change or blend the source waters to obtain optimal water quality for water treatment.

Objective and Scope

To provide a continuous record of turbidity, chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin concentrations in the Passaic River downstream from the confluence with the Pompton River at Two Bridges, New Jersey. The status of turbidity, chlorophyll-a as a measure of phytoplankton biomass, and phycocyanin concentrations will be monitored for the purpose of planning and managing water resources in the Passaic River.

Approach

Concentrations of turbidity, total chlorophyll-a, and phycocyanin will be measured hourly on the Passaic River downstream from the confluence with the Pompton River using the monitoring station at Two Bridges, New Jersey. Turbidity and chlorophyll-a/phycocyanin sensors will be operated at the existing monitoring station. The sensors will be operated and maintained to record chlorophyll-a and phycocyanin in relative fluorescence units (RFU) hourly from two locations and turbidity at 3 locations along a cross section of the river for the period October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

Water samples will be collected during routine inspections (approximately every 8 weeks), every fouling check (approximately every 4 weeks between routine inspections), and up to an additional 8 times per year depending on conditions for a total of 20 samples per year per intake. Chlorophyll-a samples will be sent to the USGS National Water Quality Laboratory (NWQL) for analysis of total chlorophyll-a and total Pheophytin-a. Phycocyanin samples will be sent to a USGS NWQL contact lab for analysis of phycocyanin. The laboratory analyses will be used for verification of the continuous monitor data and will be available for future regression analysis and modeling if requested.

Cornwell originally prepared a budget for a longer project duration for the initial pilot study task (pilot comparison of products from 4 vendors), but PVWC asked for preparation of a 26-week budget for the initial budget with the intention that additional budget be added later for additional duration of the current pilot study as well as funding for the additional tasks outlined in the workplan that have not yet been budgeted. The current purchase order (PO 233939) expires December 4, 2024, and includes \$550,000 to cover 6 months of pilot testing and one RSSCT study, both of which compare GAC products from 4 vendors, along with Microbial and Corrosion Control and other tasks.

The current pilot studies started 01/29/2024. Due to the additional time needed to study PFAS breakthrough, the project needs to be extended for another 6 mo. until February 1, 2025, and the budget needs to be increased to provide the additional funds needed for 6 more months of pilot study labor and expenses.

Consequently, the following changes are requested for PO 233939:

- Change expiration date to February 1, 2025
- Add \$270,000 to budget, thereby increasing the total to \$550,000 + \$270,000 = \$820,000

Background:

Hazen and Sawyer (Hazen), as part of scope of services under Project No. 23-PA-02, is supporting PVWC in developing and implementing the Phase 2 Enterprise Dashboard Management System for four target departments: Laboratory, Customer Service, Distribution, and Purification through four technical tasks:

- i. Develop Requirements: Gather and document business and technical requirements for the enterprise business intelligence (BI) system, ensuring alignment with IT infrastructure and the needs of the target PVWC departments and end users.
- ii. Develop Data System: Establish the foundation of the BI data system to automatically convey data from PVWC's original source systems to the Power BI Data Model in a secure and efficient manner. Set up the development environment, create a BI data warehouse, connect original source systems, design the BI Data Model, and develop extract-transform-load (ETL) processes.
- **iii.** Develop Display Layer: Build the interactive visual interface and reporting capability of the BI system. Gather user feedback and refine the dashboard pages to meet the needs of end users.
- iv. Deployment and Support: Set up the PVWC Dashboard so that it refreshes automatically in Power Bi web service and can be accessed by users via the web. Develop a User Guide and provide PVWC staff training to promote effective use and adoption of the system.

Recommendation:

Extension of the contract completion date by a total of 151 consecutive calendar days to March 17, 2025.

JUSTIFICATION FOR EXTENSION OF CONTRACT TIME

An extension of contract time is needed for two primary reasons:

1) IT Setup and System Access

The Enterprise BI Dashboard Project being developed is the first of its kind for PVWC, requiring the development of new processes and protocols, particularly that which provides an external consultant with system access and appropriate permissions and credentials. Securing the necessary system and data source access, along with configuring the development environment, necessitated the creation and alignment of new procedures, which required more extensive coordination and time than initially anticipated. The IT setup involved configuring the development environment and remote access, establishing the ETL method and tools, evaluating and procuring Power BI licenses, configuring the enterprise data warehouse and Power BI Desktop, and setting up the PVWC Power BI tenant and license assignments. Originally this was estimated to take two months, however these tasks ultimately required five months due to the need to collaborate with IT in developing and implementing these new processes. Furthermore, additional delays were incurred due to source system updates e.g. LIMS version 6.7 to version 7.2 upgrade, and pending upgrades from NEC/Touchpoint to Avaya Enghouse.

2) Stakeholder Engagement and Consensus Building

Continuous PVWC department involvement ensures the Enterprise BI Dashboard is both technically sound and highly relevant to PVWC users. Due to heavy workloads and competing needs, some departmental reviews and feedback has taken longer than anticipated.

Due to the issues above, it is requested that the completion date for the contract be extended to March 17, 2025 from the original completion date of October 17, 2024, a total of **151** consecutive calendar days extension.

FORM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter "AGREEMENT") made as of _______, 20___ between PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION ("PVWC"), a Public Utility Company organized pursuant to its enabling statute (N.J.S.A. 40:62-108 et seq.), having its principal place of business at 1525 Main Avenue, Clifton, New Jersey 07011, and Prana Water Consulting, a professional firm (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL") having a place of business at 34 Evanston Avenue, West Milford, New Jersey 07480.

WHEREAS, PVWC desires professional services as applicable, to assist PVWC in its efforts

related to **Project Number 24-PD-01** entitled **Distribution Specialty Project Management Services** (hereInafter the "PROJECT"); and

WHEREAS, PVWC requires Professional Services to assist it in implementing the PROJECT; and:

WHEREAS, PROFESSIONAL represents that it has the experience and the required professional knowledge to provide the professional services, and/or extraordinary unspecifiable services, as applicable (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL SERVICES"), and as required by PVWC in this regard as set forth in the "Public Notice", "Table of Contents", and the "Request for Proposals" of the "Request for Proposals for Professional Services (or Extraordinary Unspecifiable Services)", and Appendices A, B, C, & D of the Solicitation (and including, where applicable, Appendix E with additional technical and other requirements attached thereto); all of which, along with a copy of the PROFESSIONAL'S proposal dated September 13, 2024, are collectively referred to herein as the "PROPOSAL"; and

WHEREAS, the AGREEMENT shall be for a one-year period of time commencing on the Effective Date of this AGREEMENT as defined in Paragraph 19 herein, and for any extended periods authorized by PVWC.

WHEREAS, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL are desirous of entering into a consulting agreement to cover the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL agree that the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT are the following:

- 1. PROFESSIONAL shall provide the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL'S obligations under this AGREEMENT are solely for the benefit of PVWC and no other party is intended to benefit or have rights hereunder.
- 2. PROFESSIONAL shall perform the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES as defined under this AGREEMENT at a level customary for competent and prudent professional service providers, all as applicable, performing such services at the time and place where the services are provided ("STANDARD OF CARE"). These services will be provided by professional service providers in the appropriate disciplines, and by other professionals and individuals skilled in other technical disciplines, as appropriate. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and the coordination of all aspects of its services including reports and

other deliverables and services provided under this AGREEMENT. The services to be performed by PROFESSIONAL shall conform to the generally accepted codes and regulations applicable to the subject PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL agrees to indemnify and hold PVWC harmless from all losses and damages resulting from PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE. Further, PROFESSIONAL shall correct and re-perform any services not conforming to the required STANDARD OF CARE without additional compensation and cost to PVWC, (including, but not limited to pending written or oral testimony, reports, etc., which might occur from activities resulting from the performance of this AGREEMENT which were caused by PROFESSIONAL'S performance). In addition, PROFESSIONAL shall indemnify and hold harmless PVWC and its officers, agents and employees of PVWC from and against any losses, claims, damages, or liabilities to which PVWC may become subject insofar as and to the extent they arise out of the deviation from the STANDARD OF CARE in the performance of the services by the PROFESSIONAL, hereunder.

3. The cost of services for those portions, if any, of the PROJECT that are pre-authorized in writing by the Commission (and subsequently performed by PROFESSIONAL pursuant to this AGREEMENT for PROJECT) shall be as stipulated in **Appendix D** or in accordance with the QUALIFICATIONS **not to exceed \$225,000.00**.

PROFESSIONAL shall invoice PVWC its services hereunder after completion thereof and on the basis of reports and accompanying documents, if appropriate, on a monthly basis, including therein information as to progress in performance as against one hundred percent (100%) completion thereof and also showing amounts previously compensated hereunder, as against the total authorization. To the extent items appearing on invoices presented by PROFESSIONAL are not contested, PVWC will remit payment of the invoice as soon as it can reasonably process same in the normal course of business and barring any failure of systems related thereto or unusual staffing shortages. If at any time it appears to PROFESSIONAL that the proposed scope of services to be performed on the different aspects of any PROJECT will exceed that which was authorized by PVWC, PROFESSIONAL shall clearly indicate same in its continuing written reports. The PROJECT shall be invoiced separately. Each invoice shall include a breakdown of hours expended along with the names of individual expending said hours, along with a breakdown of charges from subcontractors where applicable and out-of-pocket expenses chargeable to the PROJECT. Each invoice shall include a summary sheet including total amount billed for the time period covered by the invoice and the time period covered, total amount billed to date, total not-to-exceed dollar amount for cost of services (said amounts as set forth or defined in Paragraph 3 herein), and balance remaining.

- 4. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible to PVWC for any subcontractors and outside associates or professional it engages to assist it in the performance of the services required under this AGREEMENT.
- 5. PVWC will provide to PROFESSIONAL all available information, including previous reports and any other data in its possession relevant to the subject PROJECT. Further, PVWC will be responsible for providing PROFESSIONAL access to all public and private property in connection with services to be performed for the PROJECT.
- 6. Both PVWC and PROFESSIONAL understand that the goal of this AGREEMENT is to complete all phases of the subject PROJECT in a reasonably expeditious fashion. To this end each pledges to the other full cooperation.
- 7. The services to be performed under this AGREEMENT for the PROJECT shall be deemed to be completed when the scope of work authorized by PVWC for the PROJECT has satisfactorily been fulfilled.

- 8. By notice in writing at any time, PVWC may change the general scope of services required by PROFESSIONAL as set forth herein. In such event an equitable adjustment, if appropriate, in compensation shall be agreed to in writing prior to PROFESSIONAL'S performing the changed services.
- 9. PROFESSIONAL shall hold secret and confidential all information designated by PVWC as confidential. PROFESSIONAL shall not reveal any designated confidential information to a third party unless the disclosing party was lawfully possessed with the information before receipt of same from the party claiming confidentiality and whose information has been designated as described herein as being confidential, or applicable law, regulation, court order or any agency of competent jurisdiction requires its disclosure; or the failure to disclose the information would pose an imminent and substantial threat to human health or the environment.
 - 10. PROFESSIONAL shall maintain insurance.

Insurance Coverages

- A. Commercial General Liability: \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence / \$1,000,000 Aggregate (Completed Operations must be included)
- B. Business Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit any one accident (All owned, hired or non-owned automobiles used in connection with this agreement)
- C. Professional Liability/Errors & Omissions Liability: \$1,000,000 each claim / \$1,000,000 annual aggregate (Must not contain cyber, privacy or network-related exclusions)
- D. Workers' Compensation: Statutory
- E. Employers' Liability: \$1,000,000

PROFESSIONAL shall provide to the PVWC certificates of insurance as to each of the above which evidence that the policies are in effect.

- 11. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey and any litigation/arbitration relating to the AGREEMENT shall be venued in New Jersey. In the event of litigation, the parties agree and consent to the action being initiated in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic County.
- 12. PROFESSIONAL represents that it is an independent professional and not an employee of PVWC.
- 13. If a dispute or complaint arises concerning this AGREEMENT, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL will negotiate a resolution of the dispute. Should negotiations be unsuccessful, the resolution of the dispute shall be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the current Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association and the arbitration proceeding shall be venued in New Jersey. Any decision rendered by the arbitrators shall be final. Judgment may be entered upon the decision in any court having jurisdiction. The decision shall not be subject to modification or appeal except to the extent permitted by Sections 10 and 11 of the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. 10, 11). Notwithstanding the aforementioned, disputes which have a total value (exclusive of interest) in excess of the dollar amount for cost of services (said dollar amount as stipulated in paragraph 3 herein) shall not be arbitrated but shall be litigated.
- 14. All notices required or intended under this AGREEMENT may be delivered in person, by facsimile or express mail. All notices shall be effective upon the date of receipt by the parties.

Notices shall be delivered or sent to the other party at the address appearing in this AGREEMENT. An address may only be changed by written notice to the other party.

- 15. During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- a) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such equal employment opportunity shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- b) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.
- c) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- d) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- e) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to afford equal employment opportunities to minority and women workers consistent with Good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2, or Good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals determined by the Division, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.
- f) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- g) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personal testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

- h) In conforming with the applicable employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- i) The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:
 - -Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval
 - -Certificate of Employee Information Report
 - -Employee Information Report Form AA302
- j) The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.
- 16. This AGREEMENT is subject to termination at the conclusion of all of the Contract work, time being of the essence as described herein, unless extended by the mutual agreement of the Parties. PVWC retains the right to terminate the PROFESSIONAL upon 15 days' notice to the PROFESSIONAL, which notice shall be effective when given to the PROFESSIONAL in writing at the PROFESSIONAL'S place of business by way of certified mail return receipt requested and regular mail. No other Notice shall be necessary. Should termination under this Article take place, the PROFESSIONAL shall be entitled to compensation for all authorized Contract work completed satisfactorily to the date of termination. PVWC shall be the sole judge of satisfactory work.
- 17. This AGREEMENT, including any schedules, attachments and referenced documents, is the entire agreement between PVWC and PROFESSIONAL. Any prior or contemporaneous agreements, promises, negotiations or representations not expressly stated herein are of no force and effect. Any changes to this AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PVWC and PROFESSIONAL.
- 18. A waiver or breach of any term, condition or covenant by a party shall not constitute a waiver or breach of any other term, condition or covenant. If any court of competent jurisdiction declares a provision of the AGREEMENT invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.
- 19. The effective date of this AGREEMENT shall be as of the date set forth hereinabove, or where such date is not indicated, the effective date of the AGREEMENT shall be when the last of the two parties is in full possession of a fully executed AGREEMENT document.
- 20. PROFESSIONAL'S hourly rates for technical and related support services and non-labor expenses shall be as set forth in the QUALIFICATIONS.
- 21. PROFESSIONAL understands and agrees that upon submission to PVWC and upon receipt of proper payment as provided for in this AGREEMENT, any reports, data, logs or other information provided to PVWC pursuant to the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT (and which are not designated in accordance with Paragraph 9 of this AGREEMENT as being confidential) are deemed to be non-proprietary to the extent that PVWC, in its sole discretion, may utilize the

information submitted for whatever purposes it deems necessary or desirable without seeking permission from PROFESSIONAL, and without providing any additional compensation to PROFESSIONAL; provided, however, that PVWC shall have sole responsibility for use of such work products in applications for which they may not originally have been intended. Reports, data, logs and other information provided to PVWC by PROFESSIONAL shall become the property of PVWC provided, however, that PROFESSIONAL shall have unrestricted right to their use.

- 22. PVWC designates the Executive Director, the Director of Engineering, or the General Counsel of the PVWC as its designated representative having authority to give instructions, receive information, define PVWC'S policies, and make decisions with respect to the scope of the work to be performed. PVWC reserves the right to change these designees from time to time and will notify PROFESSIONAL of any change(s) in writing.
- 23. Except as otherwise approved by PVWC, for the PROJECT, PVWC will be responsible for furnishing all approvals and permits from governmental authorities and other entities having jurisdiction over the scope of the work to be performed and approvals from others as may be necessary for the timely completion of the said work, including payment of all permit fees.
- 24. This AGREEMENT may be executed in several counterparts and all so executed documents shall constitute one agreement, binding on all the parties hereto, notwithstanding that all the parties are not signatory to the original or the same counterpart.

WHEREAS, Change Order No. 2 covered out-of-scope work due to unexpected subsurface conditions which included unexpected removal of and stockpiling of abandoned PSE&G gas mains that are obstructing the work area, removal of buried concrete valve chamber, removal of concrete saddle around 48-inch inlet line to Levine Reservoir, repairs to damaged unmarked electrical conduit, replacement of storm inlet and additional test pitting which further increased the total adjusted Contract Price by \$141,180.87, bringing the revised not to exceed to a total of \$6,462,912.16; and

WHEREAS, Proposed Change Order No. 3 is to cover out-of-scope work which includes the installation of yard fencing to protect materials stored onsite due to issues that the Contractor was having with the homeless

encampment, procurement and installation of stop logs at the Levine Reservoir for isolation of the inlet line to the reservoir and relocation of the storm sewer system on 21st Avenue which further increases the total adjusted Contract Price by \$289,962.40, as recommended in the correspondences from the Resident Engineer, Remington & Vernick Engineers on September 18, 2024 is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, bringing the revised not to exceed to a total of \$6,752,874.56 (total increase of 8.9% to the original price); and

Dear Mr. Porcaro:

As per our previous conversations, attached please find the proposed Change Order #3 for the above-mentioned project. The Change encompasses several scope modifications caused by unanticipated field conditions and unforeseen events during the course of construction of the project to date. These items are proposed changes from Grade Construction that RVE has reviewed and recommends for Commission approval.

An item-by-item description of the changes follows (Supplemental Item S-1 through S-13 were the subject of the previous Change Orders #1 and #2). Please note that there are several other Proposed Change Orders (PCO's) that have been submitted by Grade, mostly relating to claims for costs incurred by the delays at 21st Street and Totowa Avenue. These claims were not reviewed as a part of this Change Order; they will be negotiated with Grade at a later date.

1. Supplemental Item S-14 - Temporary Fencing at Storage Yard

During the delay in work in 2023 and 2024, an encampment of unhoused people was discovered to have been established in the yard that Grade utilized to store pipe and materials. The encampment was removed in May 2024 as part of a combined action with the City of Paterson, and a decision was made to install temporary fencing at the site to prevent future access to the project material. Grade obtained a quote for the fencing from a vendor.

Included as a part of their proposed Change Order (PCO-015), the cost of the fencing as approved by RVE and PVWC totals \$3,395.00. RVE concurs with this value and recommends inclusion of same in C.O. #3.

2. Supplemental Item S-15 - Stop Logs at Levine Reservoir

During initial work at the Levine Reservoir site, it was discovered that the inlet/outlet pipe was encased in a very large block of concrete. Grade initially tried to chip away some of the concrete to expose the pipe for a line stop installation; however, PVWC became concerned with the impact of the use of vibratory equipment on the main.

Passaic Valley Water Commission Contract #22-B-7, Water Transmission Main Improvements to the Industrial Loop Change Order #3 Page 2

It was decided to investigate alternate means of isolating the pipe, channels were found at the inlet structure for stop log installation. At the request of the Commission, Grade provided a quote for procuring the stop longs and cleaning and preparing the inlet structure channels to accept the stop logs. Successful installation of the stop logs will eliminate the need for the designed line stop at this location; the credit from the elimination of the line stop will essentially offset the extra cost of the stop log and inlet work.

Included as a part of their proposed Change Order (PCO-017), the cost of the work at the reservoir inlet is estimated by Grade at a maximum of \$122,016, This cost includes six (6) days of work by a diving subcontractor to clean the inlet channels and perform any needed repairs. At the request of the Commission, Grade has provided a daily rate for the subcontractor; payment will only be made for days the subcontractor is actually on site working. RVE concurs with this value and recommends inclusion of same in C.O. #3. The credit for the unnecessary line stop will be reflected in the Final Quantities Change Order at the end of the project.

3. Supplemental Item S-16 – Sewer Manhole Relocation at Spring Street and 21st Avenue

During the course of work on the 48" main installation, an existing storm sewer line at manhole structure was found to be laid very close to the water main (much closer than was anticipated in design) near the SW corner of the intersection of 21st Ave. and Spring Street. Because of this proximity, the disturbance for the water main replacement would interfere with the MH; therefore, it was decided to relocate the MH (which serves the storm inlets at the intersection of 21st and Spring) away from the 48" main trench.

In addition, a brick manhole was fond to be in disrepair near the SE corner of the intersection; further damage to the MH was deemed to be inevitable due to its proximity to the water main. The decision was made to replace the MH with a precast concrete unit. This work was done in consultation with the City of Paterson, which owns the sewer system.

Included as a part of their proposed Change Order (PCO-020), the cost of the manhole relocation as approved by RVE and PVWC totals \$24,130.49. RVE concurs with this value (which was approved by PVWC during initial review of the PCO) and recommends inclusion of same in C.O. #3.

4. <u>Supplemental Item S-17 – Re-Route Sewer Line in Spring Street</u>

During excavation of the existing 48" main, near the crossing of the 24" high pressure main in Spring Street, it was discovered that there was almost no vertical separation of the two mains (this was the same excavation that caused the 24" break in June). It was decided to lower the new 48" main to achieve some separation; however, this realignment conflicted with an unmarked 12" combined sewer line near the center line of Spring Street. The sewer line carries flow from one residential home and some storm drainage from Route 80.

In order to lower the sewer line, approximately 108 LF of sewer and two new manholes will be installed to relocate the line to the east of its current location; There is sufficient vertical drop in the line to lower it enough to get under the realigned 48" main. This work was done in consultation with the City of Paterson, which owns the sewer system.

Included as a part of their proposed Change Order (PCO-021), the cost of the sewer relocation as approved by RVE and PVWC totals \$140,420.68. RVE concurs with this value (which was approved by PVWC during initial review of the PCO) and recommends inclusion of same in C.O. #3.

The total recommended Change Order amount is \$289,962.40. When added to the value of C.O. #1 (\$122,175.90) and C.O. #2 (\$141,180.31), this represents a total increase to date in the Contract Value of 8.93% (an updated Change Order Log for the project is attached for your reference). RVE recommends approval of this C.O. at the Commission's meeting on September 25, 2024. Contract 22-B-07 entitled "Water Transmission Main Improvements to the Industrial Loop" was awarded to Grade Construction (Grade), of Fair Lawn, New Jersey at PVWC's May 11, 2022 Commission Meeting (Resolution No. 22-053) with a not to exceed amount of \$6,199,555.39.

Change Order No. 1 covered the unexpected removal of 6-inches thick of concrete subbase and additional test pitting used to investigate unknown subsurface conditions for removal and stockpiling of abandoned PSE&G gas mains that obstructed the work area which increased the total adjusted Contract Price by \$122,175.90.

Change Order No. 2 covered out-of-scope work due to unexpected subsurface conditions which included unexpected removal of and stockpiling of abandoned PSE&G gas mains that are obstructing the work area, removal of buried concrete valve chamber, removal of concrete saddle around 48-inch inlet line to Levine Reservoir, repairs to damaged unmarked electrical conduit, replacement of storm inlet and additional test pitting which further increased the total adjusted Contract Price by \$141,180.87.

Proposed Change Order No. 3 is to cover out-of-scope work which includes the installation of yard fencing to protect materials stored onsite due to issues that the Contractor was having with the homeless encampment, procurement and installation of stop logs at the Levine Reservoir for isolation of the inlet line to the reservoir and relocation of the storm sewer system on 21st Avenue which further increases the total adjusted Contract Price by \$289,962.40, as recommended in the correspondences from the Resident Engineer, Remington & Vernick Engineers on September 11, 2024 bringing the revised not to exceed to a total of \$6,752,874.56 (total increase of 8.9% to the original price).

The additional work and unexpected delays due to NJDOT permitting issues will require time extension to the existing contract to April 30, 2025.

Please accept this Memorandum as a formal recommendation, from the Department of Information technology, to retain the services of SHI Corp for SCADA Integrator Services. As a result of the Commission's \$800 Mill. capital project initiatives, a stream of large and complex infrastructure remediation projects will be coming online; with the residuals building already in flight. The Residuals and Levine Tanks projects come in at about \$40 Mill. each and the Filter Plant projects at another \$10 Mill.

That is roughly \$100 Mill. worth of capital projects, this year alone, with each project placing specific demands upon our SCADA environment. PVWC does not have the technical depth to handle such comprehensive workloads.

The vendor, SHI inc., will fulfill all SCADA integration design work requirements. The costs associated with each project has not been determined; they are still in the preliminary stages. The vendor's service will be retained through the New Jersey Cooperative Purchasing Alliance, at an initially estimated cost of \$176,550.00 for a 1-year period.
