

## Fire departments in Passaic Valley Water Commission service area to begin annual hydrant testing

This essential procedure, which takes place for approximately six weeks, ensures that fire hydrants are functioning properly should the need for firefighting arise.

During the testing period, residents may notice discolored water or temporary reductions in water pressure. PVWC assures residents that these are normal and temporary effects of the testing process.
